'A Season Held' presents some favourite works from our current inventory; the majority from artists who have had a longstanding relationship with Kupfer, and who are an integral part of Kupfer's story. As such, these works represent the culmination of Kupfer as it has been since 2017; supporting emerging artists to make their first gestures into a rigorous and international presence, alongside showcasing exceptional artistry from established artists. With these works, that represent Kupfer 'as was', we present a few works from artists new to us, as we grow into our ambitious new space at The Forge, with renewed intention for the future to serve artists to make the work they most want to make, and to contribute to a sustainable art ecosystem that values diversity, research, experimentation and discernment.

Thus, 'A Season Held' is a chance to celebrate all that has come before; not only since 2017 at Kupfer but in the successes and risks taken by all the artists in their evolving practises. It is also a chance for us to declare our support for their work going forward, as well as an intention to continue our mission with more rigour and clearer focus.

This show also contains a glimpse of Kupfer's new chapter as we forge a new commercial and curatorial presence in London. Our new programme will bring exceptional international artists into the gallery, as well as strengthening our residency and research programmes to allow artists the space, time and support to push existing practises into new realms. As Kupfer is a non-profit space, as a collector you can know that all sales will directly fund this mission. Join us to celebrate all that has been achieved in the past at Kupfer, and welcome in the new chapter of promise and possibility, through the lens of this extraordinary group of works.





Sheronanawe Hakihiiwe (b.1971, Pori Pori, Venezuela) is an artist of Yanomami descent, born in the Alto Orinoco region in the Venezuelan Amazon. His work introduces diverse ways of knowing physical and intangible worlds from the point of view of Yanomami culture, bringing Yanomami forms into the repertoire of global contemporary art. Hakihiiwe has had various international solo exhibitions in leading cultural institutions, most recently 'Sheroanawe Hakihiiwe: All This Is Us' (MASP, São Paulo, Brazil, 2023); 'Chosen Memories: Contemporary Latin American Art from the Patricia Phelps de Cisneros Gift and Beyond' (MoMA, 2023) and 'Siamo Foresta' (Fondation Cartier, 2023). His work is in many public collections including The British Museum and MoMA. He is represented by Cecilia Brunson in the UK and Galería Abra globally.

Luis Romero (b. 1967, Caracas, Mexico) is a visual artist, curator and editor who lives and works in Caracas. He has exhibited his work in his native Venezuela and internationally, including solo and group exhibitions in the United States, Latin America and Europe. Most recent exhibitions include 'Nothing Exists Anymore' (Kupfer, 2023) and 'Still life' (Galería Abra, Caracas, 2019). As co-director of the gallery Abra Caracas, he has been supporting the work of several Venezuelan artists since 2016, also having previously directed Oficina #1 (2006-16). His work can be found in many distinguished permanent collections including Colección Patricia Phelps de Cisneros (NY) Museo de Arte Reina Sofia (Madrid) and Galería de Arte Nacional (Caracas).

Wilson Neto (b.1980, Fortaleza, Brazil) and Vera Sampaio (b.1939, São Paulo, Brazil) have exhibited widely within Brazil and internationally, most recently together at Galeria Teo (São Paulo) and Neto at the Museum of Skopje (Skopje, Macedonia). Their work brings together aspects of daily, urban experience with a fascination for the ancient. Brazil's unique, complex and fertile mix of indigenous, African and European cultures are reflected in these works, which depict or evoke both quotidian objects, animals and human figures but also mermaids, female warriors and other folkloric elements. These works by Wilson Neto and Vera Sampaio are a collaboration which blends and merges the notions of fine art and craft, and which has friendship and mutual creative freedom at its heart.
